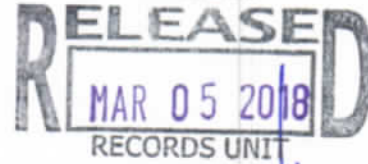

2018 NATIONAL WOMEN'S MONTH CELEBRATION

1. The whole month of March 2018 is National Women's Month.
2. Pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 224, 227 and Republic No. 6949, the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) leads the annual National Women's Month Celebration (NWMC).
3. The theme for this year 2018 is: "We Make Change Work for Women" which emphasizes that women should be active drivers in bringing about positive changes, and that they should reap from development efforts.

 - ✓ incorporate the theme in English, Filipino, Edukasyon sa Pagpapakatao, Araling Panlipunan, TLE, and other subjects which lessons can be connected to the theme,
 - ✓ conduct a maximum of 20-minute talk during the flag ceremony March 5 (Monday) and flag retreat on March 9 (Friday) 2018,
 - ✓ hang 2018 (NWMC) official streamer which can be found at PCW website,
 - ✓ participate in the online campaign thread about the observance by uploading photos, news features and other information relative to NWMC 2018 celebration,
 - ✓ use the All Women Cast Lupang Hinirang Video in agency's NWMC activities from <http://tiny.cc/all-women/lupanghinirang>.
5. Post your documentation pictures in Marikina GAD Page and submit your report on the National Women's Month Celebration 2018 to Ms. Sheryll T. Gayola , Officer-In-Charge, Office of the Schools Division Superintendent, attention: Mr. Sunny T. Cortes, GAD Division Focal Person.
